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INTRODUCTION

This syllabus follows naturally from GCSE Spanish, combining the four linguistic skills: Listening, speaking, reading and writing. The skills are practised through the media of text books, TV, listening materials and authentic press sources. Various themes are studied through the medium of Spanish, including social issues and trends together with political and artistic culture. One literary work is studied in the form of a film for the AS and both a film and a book for the A Level.

The course encourages students to:

- Develop understanding of the spoken and written forms of Spanish.
- Communicate confidently, clearly and imaginatively in Spanish through both the spoken and written words.
- Develop critical insights into the contemporary society and culture of Spanish-speaking countries.

The course will also enhance the employment prospects of students and provide an additional qualification to those seeking to progress onto higher education.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- GCSE Spanish with a minimum grade of C or 4
- A good school/College report.

COURSE STRUCTURE
The specification is assessed as follows:

- Paper 1: Listening, Reading and Writing
- Paper 2: Writing (based on literary work)
- Paper 3: Speaking

Candidates may opt for the AS level Spanish as a *standalone qualification* subject to numbers.

Candidates must note that progression to the A level involves completing an additional 2-year programme.
